

**NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY**  
**TRIBAL ENVIRONMENTAL EVALUATION**  
**PASKENTA BAND OF NOMLAKI INDIANS, PASKENTA INDIAN RESERVATION**  
**CORNING, CALIFORNIA**

Notice is hereby given that the Paskenta Band of Nomlaki Indians of Corning, California has completed a draft Tribal Environmental Evaluation (TEE), dated August 30, 2019 for a proposed expansion and renovation of the Rolling Hills Casino and Resort consisting of approximately 65,541 square feet of new construction, renovation of the existing casino of 74,423 square feet and reconfiguration of the existing parking areas. The proposed construction and renovation is planned within the existing footprint of the Rolling Hills Casino complex. This TEE has been completed in accordance with the Paskenta Environmental Policy Ordinance which was created pursuant to the Tribal-State Gaming Compact with the State of California.

The TEE was prepared for this proposed Tribal action in order to establish baseline environmental conditions, to assess the off-Reservation impacts of the proposed action, and to address cumulative effects.
