

Avoidance Measures

1. Staging Areas, Equipment and Material Storage: To avoid impacts to adjacent native vegetation and wildlife, all staging and equipment and material storage areas shall occur in existing pullouts or at currently paved locations. No vegetation clearing on public or private land is allowed for the creation of storage sites without first being cleared through Caltrans.
2. Prior to construction, if construction activities are proposed to occur during the typical nesting season (February 15 to September 1) within potential nesting habitat within the project area, a nesting bird survey shall be conducted by a qualified biologist at least two weeks prior to construction to determine presence/absence of nesting birds within the project area. Work activities shall be avoided within 150 ft. of active bird nests, until a qualified biologist has determined that young birds have fledged and left the nest. Readily visible exclusion zones shall be established in areas where nests must be avoided. USFW and CDFW shall be contracted for additional guidance if nesting birds are observed within or near the boundaries of the project site. Active nests shall not be disturbed and eggs, or young birds covered by the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA) and California fish and Wildlife Code shall not be killed, injured or harassed at any time.
