REVISED NOTICE OF PREPARATION OF A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR THE CERES GATEWAY CENTER – DATED OCTOBER 1, 2019 (STATE CLEARINGHOUSE NUMBER: 2019109006)

Dear Mr. Westbrook:

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) received a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Ceres Gateway Center.

The proposed project includes a Specific Site Plan Review, Vesting Tentative Parcel Map, and Variance to allow for the development of a commercial/retail development on 13.65+/- acres located at 2812 and 2942 East Service Road in Ceres, California 95307. It will be a commercial development with multiple buildings, including a gas station and hotel.

DTSC recommends the following issues be evaluated prior to development of the site:

- The Mitigated Negative Declaration should acknowledge the potential for project site activities to have resulted in the release of hazardous wastes/substances. In instances in which releases have occurred, further studies should be carried out to delineate the nature and extent of the contamination, and the potential threat to public health and/or the environment should be evaluated. The Mitigated Negative Declaration should also identify the mechanism(s) to initiate any required investigation and/or remediation and the government agency who will be responsible for providing appropriate regulatory oversight.
- 2. If the project requires importation of soil to backfill any excavated areas, proper sampling should be conducted to ensure imported soil is free of contamination. DTSC recommends the imported materials be characterized according to DTSC's 2001 *Information Advisory Clean Imported Fill Material*

 Since the site and surrounding areas have been used for agricultural activities, proper investigation for arsenic, other metals, and organochlorinated pesticides should be conducted in accordance with DTSC's 2008 Interim Guidance for Sampling Agricultural Properties (Third Revision) (<u>https://dtsc.ca.gov/wpcontent/uploads/sites/31/2018/09/Ag-Guidance-Rev-3-August-7-2008-2.pdf</u>). In addition, sampling should be conducted in accordance with DTSC's 2006 Interim Guidance Evaluation of School Sites with Potential Contamination from Lead Based Paint, Termiticides, and Electrical Transformers (<u>https://dtsc.ca.gov/wpcontent/uploads/sites/31/2018/09/Guidance_Lead</u> Contamination 050118.pdf).
