CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND WILDLIFE CEQA FINDINGS FOR THE AGREEMENT REGARDING PROPOSED LAKE OR STREAMBED ALTERATION NO. 1600-2020-0346-R1

Introduction

The California Environmental Quality Act (**CEQA**) (Public Resources Code section 21000, *et seq.*) and the State CEQA Guidelines (**Guidelines**) (Section 15000, et seq., Title 14, California Code of Regulations) require that no public agency shall approve or carry out a project for which a mitigated negative declaration (MND) has been completed that identifies one or more significant effects, unless such an agency makes the following finding as to each significant effect:

Changes or alterations have been required in, or incorporated into, the project which mitigate or avoid the significant effects on the environment.

As the lead agency for the project, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) adopted the MND for the Project on **November 18, 2018** CDFW found that the Project will not result in significant environmental effects with the mitigation measures required in or incorporated into the Project.

CDFW is issuing a Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement (Agreement) to the project applicant, Ms. Elizabeth Mackey representing Trout Unlimited, Inc.
