## MARIN COUNTRY CLUB STREAM RESTORATION AND FACILITIES IMPROVEMENT CEQA NOTICE OF DETERMINATION

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant, Marin Country Club (MCC), applied for a use permit pursuant to the City of Novato's (City) Waterway and Riparian Protection Ordinance and Wetland Protection and Restoration Ordinance to stabilize and restore eroded banks and degraded segments of Arroyo San Jose as it runs through the golf course at the Country Club.

Arroyo San Jose is an intermittent creek, flowing west-to-east through the approximate center of the golf course. The proposed stabilization and restoration activities include:

- Partial or full pond spillway demolition, relocation, and/or reconstitution as naturalized boulder cascades to facilitate better upstream pond water capture and use and to enhance the channel/pond environs, as well as provide long-term bank/channel stability
- Main dam retrofit with automated slide gates to replace manual flashboards for winter flood-flow passage and dry season pond storage functions
- Channel restoration and bank stabilization to correct areas where high flows have eroded banks or resulted in slump failures and are resulting in downstream sediment delivery and threatening undermining existing facilities (e.g., cart paths, cart bridge abutments)
- Replacement of an undersized storm drain that currently discharges to the north edge of Pond 4 with two smooth-walled PVC storm drains to better convey watershed/golf course runoff to the pond and resolve nuisance flooding of the Hole 18 fairway
- Sediment removal from the existing pond system to restore storage capacity (primarily deposited in the upper reaches of the pond system during the wet winter of 2016)
- Installation of bypass pipes; one from Pond 5 to Pond 4 and another from Pond 4 to Pond 2, to convey stored waters in the upper ponds to lower reservoirs for irrigation supply
