

## WHAT IS BEING PLANNED?

Caltrans proposes to construct the Interstate 580 (I-580) Safety Lighting and Power Supply Installation Project to improve existing roadway conditions and enhance traffic safety on the Altamont Pass in Alameda County. This will be accomplished by installing lighting for 4.7 miles along eastbound I-580, from West Grant Line Road Undercrossing to North Flynn Road Overcrossing near the City of Livermore. The project will also install new power poles and electrical vaults on the southern side of the same expanse of I-580 to provide power for the lighting.

## WHY THIS AD?

Caltrans has studied the impacts that the proposed project may have on the environment and has determined that the proposed project will not have a significant effect on the environment. The Initial Study (IS) with proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND)/Categorical Exclusion (CE) is the environmental document that explains why the proposed project will, with mitigation, have less than significant impacts on the environment. This public notice is to inform you of the preparation of the IS-MND/CE, that it is available for review, the time period for public comment is from October 14, 2019 to November 14, 2019, and that a public meeting is available by request."
