Potentially significant impacts as a result of proposed vineyard development and operations to: i) biological resources including special-status animal species and their habitat, and wetlands, and ii) water quality including waters of the U.S. or State.

Biological Resource Mitigation Measures to reduce potentially significant impacts to a less than significant level will include: i) avoidance of approximately 13 acres of potential special-status raptor species habitat, ii) the preservation of at least 78 acres of special-status raptor habitat occurring on-site, iii) pre-construction surveys for potential special-status bird species including avoidance measures if present, and iv) the in-field demarcation and avoidance of wetlands

Mitigation Measures to reduce potentially significant impacts to water quality, and associated impacts to jurisdictional Waters of the U.S, or State, as a result of the project to a less than significant level include, the implementation of a Road and Drainage Assessment and Improvement Plan, and the appropriate permitting of replacement and new water course crossings.
