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


Exhibit B: Project Description for Chipps Island Acquisition (Western Parcel)

The California Department of Water Resources (DWR) will obtain from Metropolitan Water District approximately 243-acres of property on Chipps Island, in Solano County. The purpose of said acquisition is habitat restoration. DWR will obtain the land and maintain it under existing conditions until it develops a habitat restoration plan and CEQA analysis for that plan.
