The project is a mixed-use commercial and residential development on a 3.36-acre site at the intersection of Glen Canyon and Mt. Hermon Road. Project land uses include 24,973 sf. of commercial (e.g. retail and office) eight townhomes, and 44 apartments. In addition to the certification of an EIR, required project entitlements include the project involves a minor land division, planned development, use permit, General Plan amendment, and zoning change (for Lot 1). The project site is a vacant lot on the northeast side of Mt. Hermon Road and north of Glen Canyon Road in the City of Scotts Valley. An EIR will be prepared for the project without preparing an Initial Study as it is clear that and EIR will be required.
