Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:

The City proposes to install a storm water diversion junction structure along Ball Road at Western Avenue and just west of Knott Avenue, as well as a retention/detention system within the abandoned rail line owned by OCTA. This system will divert storm water flow from the main storm line on Ball Road, and draw storm water south along Western Avenue and then west along Sunview Drive, until it reaches the abandoned rail line. The infiltration system will allow the storm water to percolate into the ground water, between Sunview Drive and Ball Road.
