Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed Project is the construction of a 5-MW solar PV energy-generating facility and battery storage system (BESS) facility on ±30 acres of 40 undeveloped acres. The site is situated within Kings County, California, along the Kings County/Kern County line, between California State Route 33 (SR-33) and Interstate 5 (I-5), approximately 0.5 mile east of 25th Avenue. The proposed Project consists of solar modules mounted on single-axis trackers that follow the east-west movement of the sun. The solar cells are covered by anti-reflective glass. At peak production, the 5-MW solar energy facility would supply enough clean energy to power up to 1,250 residential homes per year.
