NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR 2017, COASTAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT, CDP19-013, 207 13<sup>th</sup> STREET, DEL MAR (SCH# 2019119079)

Dear Ms. Crutchfield.

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) reviewed the Negative Declaration and initial Study for Coastal Development Permit, CDP19-013 (also known as the 13th Street Residential Demolition Project), which proposes demolition of an existing one-story residence located at 207 13th Street, in Del Mar.

The project proposes to demolish an existing building and associated storage shed in preparation for constructing a new residence.

Based on the review of the submitted document, DTSC has the following comments:

- 1. The residence and associated asphalt or concrete-paved surface areas are to be demolished, an investigation/survey should be conducted for the presence of related hazardous chemicals such as lead-based paints or products, mercury, and asbestos containing materials. If these hazardous chemicals are identified. proper precautions should be taken during demolition and disposal activities which should be in accordance with all applicable ordinances, regulations and laws.
- 2. DTSC also recommends an evaluation of potential presence of perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), including perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) and perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) due to their persistency in the environment
