Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of the Project:

The Kern Community College District - Porterville College Campus will perform upgrades and repairs to the existing stadium (Project). All work will take place on the Campus stadium footprint. The proposed Project will not increase capacity or expand the Stadium beyond its current footprint. The Campus stadium provides a recreational and athletic venue for the students, faculty, staff, and the residents of Porterville.

Work will include the following items.

- Demolition of two inner track lanes.
- Resurface the entire track with a new rubber coating.
- Expand and refurbish the football field to accept use as a soccer and lacrosse field.
- Perform maintenance on the irrigation system and rework the system.
- Repaint the bleachers and bring them into compliance to current safety codes and safety standards.
- Perform renovations to the Press Box.
- Perform upgrades to the exiting restrooms in order to bring them into current code compliance.
- Install American Disability Act (ADA) walkways and access routes.
- Remove the current scoreboard and replace it with a new soccer scoreboard.
- Replace lighting and public address system.

Reasons Why the Project is Exempt:

15300 - CATEGORICAL EXEMPTIONS

- > (d) Restoration or rehabilitation of deteriorated or damaged structures, facilities, or mechanical equipment to meet current standards of public health and safety, unless it is determined that the damage was substantial and resulted from an environmental hazard such as earthquake, landslide, or flood;
 - The replacement and upgrades to the existing college stadium to upgrade the facility to the current code requirements will alleviate aging surfaces and update structures, will bring the stadium into compliance with current code requirements.
