PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND ENVIRONMENTAL SETTING (DESCRIBE THE PROJECT ACTIVITIES, PROJECT SITE AND ITS SURROUNDINGS, ITS LOCATION, AND THE ENVIRONMENTAL SETTING):

<u>Project Area:</u> The area has been managed for timber production since the late 1800s but since the 1960s has been shifted into even-aged timber management specifically.

The adjacent properties are a mix of the wildland urban interface with isolated houses, an industrial park, railroad tracks, large contiguous brush fields, and native mixed conifer stands.

The project area is located east of the community of Weed, and is roughly 8,100 feet long and 200 feet wide which covers 36 acres. The project area ranges from 3,880 feet to 3,990 feet in elevation with slopes ranging from 0%-30%. Vegetation is comprised of 40-year-old ponderosa pine plantations, native mixed conifer stands, and scattered pockets of brush species. The mixed conifer stands are comprised of ponderosa pine, incense cedar, sugar pine, Douglas-fir and white fir. The scattered brush pockets are composed of manzanita (*Arbutus spp.*), deer brush (*Ceanothus integerrimus*), and snow brush (*Ceanothus velutinus*) and various grasses.

<u>Treatment Application</u>: A masticator or hand crews will be utilized to remove all brush species and thin trees (10" in diameter or less) to an 18-to-25-foot spacing. The best growing trees will be retained. Residual trees will be pruned to a 6-foot height. No healthy, mature, scenic trees will be removed. Wood biomass created by the masticator will be broadcast back into the treatment area, and will be no more than 12" deep. Wood debris crated by hand crews will be piled and burned or piled and pulverized by the masticator. Piles to be burned will be established as far away from residual trees as possible to reduce scorching, and burned as climatic conditions allow.
