**PUBLIC NOTICE**: The City of San Diego as the Lead Agency has determined that the project described below will require the preparation of a Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). This Notice of Preparation of a PEIR and Scoping Meeting was publicly noticed and distributed on January 16, 2020. **SCOPING MEETING**: The City of San Diego Planning Department will hold a public scoping on **Wednesday, January 29, 2020,** from 6 PM to 8 PM in Room 2 of the North Clairemont Recreation Center located at 4421 Bannock Avenue, San Diego, CA 92117. **Please note that depending on the number of attendees, the meeting could end earlier than 8 PM.** Written comments regarding the proposed PEIR's scope and alternatives will be accepted at the meeting.

**PROJECT NAME/NUMBER:** Clairemont Community Plan Update

**COMMUNITY PLAN AREA:** Clairemont Mesa

**COUNCIL DISTRICT: 2 and 6**




Figure 1: Clairemont Community Plan Area Boundary

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The project is a comprehensive update of the Clairemont Mesa Community Plan, which was originally adopted in 1989 and has undergone over 7 amendments since. As shown in attached Figure 1, Clairemont is in the geographic center of the city, is accessible from Interstate (I-) 5, I-805, and State Route (SR-) 52, and will be served by the Mid-Coast Blue Line Trolley, which will connect Clairemont to Downtown San Diego, the University community, and the citywide transit network.

Clairemont is an urbanized residential community with several shopping centers, parks and recreational facilities, and educational opportunities.

The Community Plan Planning Area is generally bounded by SR-52 on the north, I-805 on the east, the southern portion of the Tecolote Canyon Natural Park and Tecolote Road on the south, and I-5 on the west, encompassing an area of approximately 6,755 acres. Figure 1 shows the planning boundaries. Clairemont is bordered by several other community planning areas: Linda Vista to the south; Kearny Mesa to the east; University to the north; and La Jolla, Pacific Beach, and Mission Bay Park to the west.

The Community Plan is being updated through a community-driven process that entails community workshops and open houses, stakeholder meetings, online engagement, and other outreach activities. A subcommittee of the Clairemont Community Planning Group has also been actively engaged in the process. The updated Community Plan is anticipated to include policies and actions to foster a mixed-use, transit-oriented, and pedestrian-friendly Clairemont community, promote additional housing to accommodate a diverse range of household sizes and incomes, and preserve and provide additional open spaces.
