**Description of Project:** The Fremont Union High School District (District) Measure CC Bond projects include various improvements at existing District facilities to serve existing and projected enrollment. At the Cupertino High School campus, the District proposes the following improvements:

- modernizing 57 existing classrooms (e.g., HVAC, lighting, flooring, roofing, technology, furniture, fixtures, and equipment),
- replacing the Main Canopy Building and Science Building roofs,
- replacing the existing baseball field grass with synthetic turf,
- formalizing the existing Finch Avenue athletic field entry, and
- reopening the Loree Avenue school entry.

No new classrooms are proposed by the project. All proposed project improvements would occur within the boundary of the existing CHS campus.

**Exempt Status:** One or more of the following Categorical Exemptions are applicable to the proposed improvements at Cupertino High School:

Class 1 - Section 15301. Existing Facilities: Operation, repair, maintenance or minor alterations to existing public and private facilities involving no or negligible expansion of existing or former use.

Class 2 - Section 15302. Replacement or Reconstruction: Replacement or reconstruction of structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site for substantially the same purpose.

Class 3 - Section 15303. New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures: Construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures; installation of small new equipment and facilities in small structures; and the conversion of small structures from one use to another where only small modifications are made to the exterior of the structure.

Class 4 - Section 15304. Minor Alterations to Land: Minor public or private alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation that does not involve the removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees.

Class 11 - Section 15311. Accessory Structures: Construction or replacement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities.

Class 14 - Section 15314. Minor Additions to Schools: Minor additions to schools within school grounds where the addition does not increase student capacity by more than 25% or ten classrooms.

Class 30 - Section 15330. Minor Actions to Prevent, Minimize, Stabilize, Mitigate, or Eliminate the Release or Threat of Release or Hazardous Waste or Hazardous Substances: Any minor cleanup actions taken to prevent, minimize, stabilize, mitigate, or eliminate the release of hazardous waste or substances which are small or medium removal actions costing \$1 million or less.

**Reasons Why Project is Exempt:** The proposed improvements to the existing school facilities are minor and would occur within the boundary of the existing Cupertino High School campus. The project does not propose new classrooms. Therefore, the proposed project would not increase original capacity by more than 25 percent or ten classrooms.

Per section 15300.2 of the CEQA Guidelines, it has been determined that the project is not located on a hazardous waste site and would not result in a significant impact due to unusual circumstances, damage scenic resources, affect an historic resource, or result in a cumulative impact. For these reasons and those stated above, the project is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
