Project Title: Wise Stream Crossings Project (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. EPIMS-08421-R1)

Project Location: The project to be completed is located within the Russian River watershed, approximately 2.1 miles Northeast of the town of Ridge, County of Mendocino, State of California. The project is located in Section 2, T17N, R13W, Mount Diablo and Meridian; in the Laughlin U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 106-060-07; latitude 39.35168 N and longitude -123.2672 W at the point of diversion (POD).

Project Description: The project is limited to 1 encroachment. The encroachment is for a stream crossing on an unnamed tributary of Davis Creek. The work required is to assess the culvert and to maintain or upgrade the crossing depending on it's size, function and condition. If work is deemed necessary for this encroachment, it may include excavation, removal of the failing culvert(s), replacement with new properly sized culvert, backfilling and compaction of fill, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion.
