Subject: Tribal Cultural Resources Under the California Environmental Quality Act,

AB 52 (Gatto, 2014), Notification of Consultation Opportunity, Pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21080.3.1 for the *Waste Discharge* Requirements for Discharges Related to Timber Harvesting and Related Land Management Activities Conducted by Humboldt Redwood Company,

LLC, in the Stitz Creek Watershed, Humboldt County

The North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) is undertaking the following project: issuance of Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) for discharges related to timber harvesting and related land management activities conducted by Humboldt Redwood Company, LLC, in the Stitz Creek watershed, in Humboldt County, California.




Figure 1. Stitz Creek Watershed Location Map

Below please find a description of the proposed project, the name of our project point of contact, and a map showing the project location (Figure 1).

Description of Proposed Project:

Land use within the watershed is consistent with timber production zoning (TPZ) and has been predominantly devoted to timber production since the early 1900s. This project is a proposal to consider adoption of Waste Discharge Requirements that would regulate the discharge of waste to surface water from ongoing timber operations in the Stitz Creek Watershed, Humboldt County, California.

Project Location:

Stitz Creek is a tributary to the Eel River, which drains to the Pacific Ocean. The Stitz Creek watershed is located in northern coastal California approximately 3.5 river miles
