NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given that the City of Del Mar will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, September 15, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. (Via Teleconference Only) where the Planning Commission will be asked to provide a recommendation to the City Council regarding the Program Environmental Impact Report and the General Plan Amendment for the proposed 6th Cycle Housing Element Update

<u>Location</u>: The 6th Cycle Housing Element Update (HEU) will facilitate housing citywide through various Housing Programs on identified Candidate Sites as described in the 6th Cycle HEU Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR), including but not limited to the following sites if various programs are selected and implemented:

- New housing opportunities in the Central Commercial (CC), North Commercial (NC), Professional Commercial (PC), and Public Facilities (PF) Zones
- Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) on lots that allow residential citywide
- City-owned land including Candidate Site 7 at 28th Street (RM-East Zone); Site 11 at 201 Court Street (Public Facilities (PF) Zone); Site 55 at 10th Street City Hall Expansion Lot (PF Zone); and Sites 63 and 64 at 9th Street (PF Zone)
- State-owned Fairgrounds properties on Candidate Sites 2A-2H if the City is able to enter an agreement with the State; otherwise, a program to rezone Candidate Sites 1A-1F (North Bluff) and/or Sites 98A-98C (South Stratford) will be required to meet State Housing law if the City is unable to enter into an agreement

Environmental Status: A Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) with a Mitigation, Monitoring, and Reporting Program (MMRP) was prepared and circulated for the 6th Cycle HEU (State Clearinghouse (SCH) No. 2020029064):

<u>Description</u>: A request for the Planning Commission to review and consider the 6th Cycle HEU PEIR and MMRP; review and discuss the proposed Housing Programs and approach identified in the proposed Housing Plan; consider how it relates to other Community Plan (General Plan) Elements; and recommend that the City Council certify the PEIR and MMRP and approve the General Plan Amendment to amend the Del Mar Community Plan for the 6th Cycle HEU. It is anticipated that the HEU must accommodate adequate sites for a total of 175 units, which includes 163 units for the 6th Cycle Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) (includes 101 very-low and low-income units) and an additional 12 low-income units that are a carryover requirement from the City's 5th Cycle Housing Element. At a future hearing, the City Council will consider whether to certify the PEIR and MMRP, approve the 6th Cycle HEU as part of the City's Community Plan, and authorize submission to State Housing and Community Development for certification review.

Under California Government Code 65009, if you challenge the nature of the proposed action in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or written correspondence delivered to the City at, or prior to, the public hearing.
