Project Decription (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed project consists of an application for a coastal development permit for the demolition of portions of a mobile home park wastewater treatment system, abandonment of a septic tank, and installation of a new wastewater treatment system, including a water recycling plant, electrical equipment on concrete pads, a new pipeline, and construction of a new building housing sludge and disinfection equipment, and retaining walls. The project is located in the Mobile Home Residential (MH) and Commercial Visitor Serving 1 (CV 1) zoning districts. The complete project description is provided in the Initial Study. The project requires a variance for a reduced front yard setback and for a reduced setback from environmentally sensitive habitat area.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The project is not anticipated to have a significant impact.

The initial study identified potential impacts to biological resources, but were considered less than significant with mitigation measures. Mitigation measures include documentation of tree condition, tree monitoring, planting of replacement trees or payment of in-lieu fee in the event trees die or have reduced health or vigor.

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
