



NOTICE

Each project applicant shall remit to the county clerk the environmental filing fee before or at the time of filing a Notice of Determination (Pub. Resources Code, § 21152; Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subdivision (d); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5). Without the appropriate fee, statutory or categorical exemption, or a valid No Effect Determination issued by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), the Notice of Determination is not operative, vested, or final, and shall not be accepted by the county clerk.

COUNTY DOCUMENTARY HANDLING FEE

The county clerk may charge a documentary handling fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per filing in addition to the environmental filing fee (Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subd. (e); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5, subd. (g)(1)). A county board of supervisors shall have the authority to increase or decrease the fee or charge, that is otherwise authorized to be levied by another provision of law, in the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee or charge is levied (Gov. Code, § 54985, subd. (a)).

COLLECTION PROCEDURES FOR COUNTY GOVERNMENTS

Filing Notice of Determination (NOD):

- Collect environmental filing fee or copy of previously issued cash receipt. (*Do not collect fee if project applicant presents a No Effect Determination signed by CDFW. An additional fee is required for each separate environmental document. An addendum is not considered a separate environmental document. Checks should be made payable to the county.*)
- Issue cash receipt to project applicant.
- Attach copy of cash receipt and, if applicable, previously issued cash receipt, to NOD.
- Mail filing fees for **CRP** document to CDFW prior to filing the NOD or equivalent final approval (Cal. Code Regs. Tit. 14, § 753.5 (b)(5)). The CRP should request receipt from CDFW to show proof of payment for filing the NOD or equivalent approval. Please mail payment to address below made attention to the Cash Receipts Unit of the Accounting Services Branch.

If the project applicant presents a **No Effect Determination** signed by CDFW, also:

- Attach No Effect Determination to NOD (*no environmental filing fee is due*).

Filing Notice of Exemption (NOE) (*Statutorily or categorically exempt project (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, §§ 15260-15285, 15300-15333)*)

- Issue cash receipt to project applicant.
- Attach copy of cash receipt to NOE (*no environmental filing fee is due*).

Within 30 days after the end of each month in which the environmental filing fees are collected, each county shall summarize and record the amount collected on the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31) and remit the amount collected to the State Treasurer. Identify the remittance on Form No. CA25 as "Environmental Document Filing Fees" per Fish and Game Code section 711.4.

The county clerk shall mail the following documents to CDFW on a monthly basis:

- ✓ A photocopy of the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31)
- ✓ CDFW/ASB copies of all cash receipts (including all voided receipts)
- ✓ A copy of all CDFW No Effect Determinations filed in lieu of fee payment
- ✓ A copy of all NODs filed with the county during the preceding month
- ✓ A list of the name, address and telephone number of all project applicants for which an NOD has been filed. If this information is contained on the cash receipt filed with CDFW under California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 753.5, subdivision (e)(6), no additional information is required.

DOCUMENT RETENTION

The county shall retain two copies of the cash receipt (for lead agency and county clerk) and a copy of all documents described above for at least 12 months.

RECEIPT NUMBER

- # The first two digits automatically populate by making the appropriate selection in the County/State Agency of Filing drop down menu.
- # The next eight digits automatically populate when a date is entered.
- # The last three digits correspond with the sequential order of issuance for each calendar year. For example, the first receipt number issued on January 1 should end in 001. If a county issued 252 receipts for the year ending on December 31, the last receipt number should end in 252. CDFW recommends that counties and state agencies 1) save a local copy of this form, and 2) track receipt numbers on a spreadsheet tabbed by month to ensure accuracy.

**RESOLUTION FINDING THE VALLEY VIEW CHARTER MONTESSORI MIDDLE
SCHOOL LUNCH AREA PROJECT EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA
ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT AND APPROVING THE FILING AND
RECORDATION OF A NOTICE OF EXEMPTION**

RESOLUTION NO. 20-06

WHEREAS, the Buckeye Union School District ("District") owns and operates the Valley View Charter Montessori School located at 1665 Blackstone Parkway, El Dorado Hills, CA 95762;

WHEREAS, on February 19, 2020 the Board authorized District staff to enter into a contract for services with Kirk S. Brainerd (Architect) to prepare construction documents, and administration services for Valley View Charter Montessori Middle School Lunch Area Project ("CEQA Project");

WHEREAS, the District must comply with the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") before approving the CEQA Project; and

WHEREAS, exemptions to CEQA are set forth in Article 19 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations ("CEQA Guidelines"); and

WHEREAS, CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 sets forth an exemption from CEQA for improvements upon existing facilities where the project consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alternation of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing at the time of the Lead Agency's determination; and

WHEREAS, CEQA Guidelines Section 15304 sets forth an exemption from CEQA for minor alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which do not involve the removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry or agricultural purposes; and

WHEREAS, CEQA Guidelines Section 15311 sets forth an exemption from CEQA for construction or placement of minor structures accessory to (appurtenant to) existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities; and

WHEREAS, the CEQA Project is not located in an area of statewide, regional or area-wide concerns as identified in CEQA Guidelines Section 15206(b)(4); and

WHEREAS, the District has considered whether the CEQA Project may have significant impacts on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the District has concluded, through its own independent review and analysis, that the CEQA Project will not have a significant impact on the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE BUCKEYE UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the above recitals are all true and correct.

Section 2. That the District has considered whether the CEQA Project may have significant impacts on the environment.

Section 3. That the District has concluded, after reviewing the CEQA Project, through its own independent review and analysis, that the CEQA Project will not have a significant impact on the environment.

Section 4. That the CEQA Project will not result in damage to scenic resources pursuant to Public Contracts Code Section 21084.

Section 5. That the Real Property is not located in an area of statewide, regional, or area-wide concerns as identified in CEQA Guidelines Section 15206(b)(4).

Section 6. That the CEQA Project will involve negligible or no expansion beyond the existing use of the Real Property.

Section 7. That the CEQA Project is subject to CEQA Guidelines Section 15301, 15304 and 15311 and is therefore exempt from CEQA.


Section 8. The District Superintendent, or designee, is instructed to file and/or record a Notice of Exemption from the California Environmental Quality Act, consistent with this Resolution, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", with any and all appropriate public agencies or entities, subject only to minor non-substantive revisions, if necessary.

Section 9. In the event any section or portion of this Resolution shall be determined invalid or unconstitutional, such section or portion shall be deemed severable and all other sections or portions hereof shall remain in full force and effect. The Board hereby declares that it would have passed this Resolution and each section, subsection,

sentence, clause or phrase irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared to be unconstitutional.


