Project Title: Rivera Water Diversion Project (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2019-0908-R1)

Project Location (include county): The project to be completed is located within the Klamath River watershed, approximately 1.1 miles south of the town of Orleans, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Section 6, T10N, R6E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Orleans U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 529-272-014; latitude 41.2875 N and longitude 123.5348 W at the point of diversion (POD).

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2019-0908-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Julian Rivera.

The project is limited to two encroachments. One encroachment is for water diversion for domestic use from an unnamed tributary to the Klamath River. Work for the water diversion will include modification, use, and maintenance of the water diversion infrastructure. The second proposed encroachment will permit removal of a water diversion structure and associated material from an unnamed tributary to the Klamath River. This point of diversion (POD) is not in compliance with CDFW and is located on federal forest lands. As part of this encroachment, all diversion infrastructure will be removed and the stream channel will be altered by hand tools as needed to restore the natural width and grade.
