The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes to improve worker safety by paving areas beyond the gore and constructing maintenance vehicle pullouts at various locations from post mile (PM) 8.3-8.6 and 9.1-11.4 in Sacramento County. The purpose of this project is to improve worker safety by reducing the frequency and duration of workers exposed to traffic and provide safe access to roadway facilities. Proposed work includes paving areas beyond the gore and narrow areas, installing vegetation control, installing access control fencing and gates, paving slopes, and replacing/constructing maintenance vehicle pullouts. The project scope also included the relocation of utility boxes. (continued on page 2).
