
Notice of Intent to Adopt a Negative Declaration Study Results Available

What's Being Planned:

The California Department of Transportation (CALTRANS) is considering the "Tehachapi Maintenance Station Relocation" project, which proposes to construct a new maintenance station in the City of Tehachapi in Kern County.



Why This Ad: CALTRANS has studied the effects this project may have on the environment. Our studies show it will not significantly affect the quality of the environment. The report that explains why it is called a Negative Declaration (ND) and Initial Study.
