**CARLTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PAVING PROJECT
NOTICE OF EXEMPTION DISCUSSION**

Project Description

Existing Conditions

Carlton Elementary School, located at 2421 Carlton Avenue in San Jose is owned and operated by the Union School District. The school is in a single-family residential neighborhood, with houses directly across the street from the school entrance/parking lot on Carlton Ave where there is a sidewalk and landscaping. Paving is proposed on three sections of the existing school grounds where there is a need to repair and/or replace damaged asphalt.

Proposed Project

The Carlton Elementary School Paving Project would consist of:

- Replace two sections of damaged asphalt on existing courtyards with concrete paving (5,588 sq. ft. combined):
 - 2,625 sq. ft. in the northwest exterior courtyard
 - 2,963 sq. ft. in the northeast exterior courtyard
- Replace damaged asphalt paving on existing school recreation courts (19,743 sq. ft.)

The project would be constructed in one phase: June – August 2020.

The purpose of this project is to replace damaged asphalt paving in order to properly maintain the facility and prevent safety hazards. No other construction on the school grounds is proposed.

Categorical Exemption Analysis

Class 1 Exemption

The CEQA Class 1 Exemption applies to minor alteration of existing facilities, including mechanical equipment and electrical conveyances as well as repairs and maintenance, where there would be negligible or no expansion of existing use (per CEQA Guidelines Section 15301). Minor alterations of existing streets, sidewalks, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities is also covered under this exemption (Section 15301 (c)). Further, this exemption includes restoration or rehabilitation of deteriorated or damaged structures, facilities, or mechanical equipment to meet current standards of public health and safety Section 15301 (d)).

The project would involve replacing damaged asphalt paving in three sites on the existing school grounds, with negligible or no expansion of existing use. Therefore, this exemption would apply (assuming no exceptions to the exemptions apply).

Analysis of Possible Exceptions to Class 1 Exemption

Per CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2, exceptions to the Section 15301 Categorical Exemption can apply (and make the exemption not applicable to a project) where the following occur:

Cumulative Impact. This exception would apply if the project were to contribute to significant impacts to a resource in combination with other proposed new development nearby. Currently, no additional projects are proposed for Carlton Elementary School. Therefore, no off-site impacts or cumulative on-site noise and air pollution impacts are anticipated. No off-site projects are known to be proposed in proximity of the school based on review of the City of San Jose's proposed development sites.

- **Scenic Highways.** This exception would apply if the project were to result in damage to scenic resources within a scenic highway corridor. The project site is not within or visible from any designated scenic highways, so this exception would not apply. In addition, the paving project would not create a visual impact in the neighborhood because the proposed paving areas would be internal to the campus, surrounded by existing buildings, or otherwise not be visible to the surrounding neighborhood.
- **Hazardous Waste Sites.** This exception would apply if the project were to be located on a hazardous waste site listed pursuant to California Government Code section 65962.5. A search of the State Envirostor database conducted on January 27, 2020, found no listed hazardous wastes sites on or within two miles of the school site. (http://www.envirostor.dtsc.ca.gov/public/map/?global_id=21880002)
- **Historical Resources.** This exception would apply if the project were to potentially significantly adversely affect an historical resource. The proposed project includes no alterations to the existing school buildings, and therefore would not have the potential to adversely affect any historical resources.
- **Significant Effect.** The exception would apply if the project would have the potential for a significant effect to the environment due to unusual circumstances. Unusual circumstances may include historic structures, hazardous materials contamination, protected species or habitats, and other similar conditions. There are no other unusual circumstances on the site and there is no potential for significant effect, therefore this exception would not apply.

General Rule Exemption

Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to environmental review. In such cases, the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects that have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. (See CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3)). As described above, the proposed project does not have the potential to result in a significant impact to the physical environment. Therefore, this exemption would apply.

Conclusions

As discussed above, the project is within the parameters of the Class 1 Categorical Exemption and the General Rule Exemption. Further, as detailed above, none of the exceptions to the Class 1 exemption would apply. Therefore, these exemptions would apply to the proposed project.
