Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The project will not result in any potentially significant impacts. The less than significant impacts associated with the project are related to air quality and noise impacts during construction, and the discovery of cultural, tribal and paleontological resources during construction activities.

The Noise and Air Impact analysis considered cumulative impacts in the analyses, and mitigation measures would be required to reduce cumulative impacts with noise and air quality. The mitigation measures proposed will reduce the impacts to air quality and noise, as described in mitigation measures AIR-1, and NOI-1 through 4. The mitigation measures will limit the number of truckloads per day, require the screening of rooftop equipment, and require the placement of a six foot tall fence along the rear property line, prior to issuance of a building permit, to reduce noise impacts during construction.

According to the cultural resources assessment prepared for the Project ,13 cultural resource studies have taken place resulting in the recording of one cultural resource within one mile of the project site. The nearest cultural resource was a historic-period single-family residence approximately one mile to the east of the project site. Of the 13 previous studies, none have previously assessed the project site, and no cultural resources have been previously within its boundaries. Although the Project Site doesn't contain any documented cultural resources, there remains the possibility that undiscovered, buried resources (including archaeological and tribal cultural resources) might be encountered during construction. Incorporation of mitigation measures CR-1, GEO-1 and TCR-1 would reduce any potential impacts to any undiscovered resources to less than significant and ensure that the Proposed Project would not eliminate important examples of the major periods of California history or prehistory
