Project Description

Caltrans proposes a state funded maintenance project in Humboldt County at the District 1 Maintenance shop located near post miles (PM) 77.3 and Highway 101 in Eureka, California.

The purpose and need for this project are to replace failing asphalt at the District 1 Shop to ensure worker safety at the existing facility. Work will consist of cold plane AC pavement, overlaying with Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) – Type A - to a depth of 0.25 feet, replacing HMA dike, placing imported borrow behind dike, repairing structural section with crack treatment, fog sealing existing pavement, adjusting utility frame covers to grade, replacing pavement delineation, repairing/replacing the concrete parking bumpers, and replacing the gate loops (in the pavement). All work will be within the existing State right of way. The HMA overlay will be confined to existing edge of pavement. No Construction Area Signs or Portable Changeable Message Signs will be required for this project. There will be no tree removal.

Typical equipment expected for this project potentially include Misc. PU Trucks, Trailers, Water Buffalo trailer, Pavers, Rollers, Bobcat w/misc. attachments (i.e. grinder, saw cut blade), Backhoe, Dump trucks, viberplate or jumping jack, tack or crack seal trailer- hot pot, Dike machine if applicable, and small hand wheeler or truck striping machine.

The project activities will occur over a duration of approximately 20 working days, may occur during day and/or nighttime, and are expected to be constructed in the year 2020.

Traffic Control

The contractor would be required to comply with Caltrans 2018 plans and specs, and to obtain an encroachment permit from the County of Humboldt or the city of Eureka to address any shoulder and/or lane closures.

Sediment and Erosion Control

The contractor will be required to implement all applicable measures within the contract including Caltrans's 2018 Standard Specifications and Plans.

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Environmental Analysis

Aesthetic/Visual

A Visual Impact Assessment level questionnaire was completed on April 13, 2020. The project will result in minimal negative visual changes to the environment and will impacts will be less than significant.

Air Quality/Noise/Greenhouse Gas conducted on February 26, 2020. According to the assessment, the project is a Type III project that will not cause an increase in operational or long-term impacts on air quality, noise, or GHGs, but will have construction related (short-term) impacts. Generation of short-term construction related noise, and the generation of short-term construction air emissions of fugitive dust and exhaust from construction equipment are to be controlled and reduced through the use of the 2018 standard specifications (e.g. Section 14-9). Additionally, the project will not generate operational GHG emissions, and would implement GHG reduction or avoidance measures (standard BMPs) where feasible to reduce construction GHG emissions. Therefore, project impacts are compliant with all applicable plans and will be less-than-significant. Lastly, the project would not contribute to a cumulatively considerable impact.

Biological Resources

A Biological Resources Evaluation Memo was completed by Caltrans Biologist on May 11, 2020. The memo concluded the project will have no impact or take on any federal or state listed threatened, endangered or sensitive species of concerns and will have no impact to designated critical habitat.

Cultural Resources

A screening memo was completed by Caltrans Professionally Qualified Staff on April 28, 2020. Based on the scope of the construction activities, these undertakings have no potential to affect historic properties.

Hazardous Waste

An electronic Initial Site Assessment (ISA) was completed by Caltrans on March 5, 2020. Based on the review, minor hazardous waste/materials will be encountered within project limits. Additionally, the ISA noted that the project work site is on the *Hazardous Waste and Substances Site List (Cortese List)* due to Caltrans Maintenance Yard Underground storage tanks. However, since there are no anticipated excavations that would affect these tanks, and the remedial action for the former Caltrans Maintenance Yard underground storage tanks has been completed, a *No Further Action* notification by the County of Humboldt Department of Public Health Division of Environmental Health was issued. Furthermore, minor hazardous waste/materials are routine construction issues that will be managed in the construction contract through standard BMPs and the inclusion of any Special Standard Provisions (SSPs). As a result, the project will not have any impacts related to hazardous waste and will be less-than-significant.

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Other Environmental Resources

All work will be conducted within Caltrans's right of way. Recreational facilities are not present. A water quality assessment checklist was completed and concluded that the project is exempt from a water quality assessment. The project is out of coastal jurisdiction and implementation of Standard BMPs and standard measures will ensure there are no impacts to environmental resources. The project qualifies for a Common-Sense exemption under 14 CCR § 15061 – Review for Exemption and is not subject to further CEQA review.
