Project Description

A Director's Order was issued to replace failed groundwater pumping equipment at the Swanston Pump Station in Sacramento County on Route 160 at post mile 46.19. The scope of work includes replacing the current 15 HP vertical shaft remote motor pump assembly with a new 20 HP submersible pump, replace the current electrical system to interface with the new submersible pump, and incidental work. This project is needed to avoid the failure or threat of failure to the transportation system and to prevent or mitigate the loss or impairment of life, health, property, and essential public services.

All staging and work would take place within the Caltrans right-of-way. No borrow or disposal is required. No need for consultation or coordination. No permits are required.
