This project involves installation of a vault toilet in the north Montara parking lot (south of Martini Creek). Plans are attached. An ADA CXT vault toilet will be installed, and aggregate base paving will be installed between the existing ADA pathway and the new vault toilet.

The project is adjacent to the existing parking lot and existing pathway, and is within an area previously disturbed by highway construction. The project will impact an area of less than 500 square feet; new construction will cover an area of less than 300 square feet. Environmental review for the construction of the parking lot included this project site within the review footprint. No environmental impacts were identified for that larger project.

Existing vegetation consists of some common native coastal scrub species (such as coyote bush and California sage) with some invasive exotic species (such as poison hemlock and shortpod mustard). No sensitive species are known from the project vicinity. Areas disturbed by this project will be replanted with locally-collected native speces.

The project site is within the vicinity of known cultural resources. Previous studies by California State Parks cultural resource staff have determined that there are no known resources within the area likely to be impacted by this project. In the event that cultural material is found during excavation for the vault, work will stop until cultural resource staff approve continuing the project.

The vault toilet will be adjacent to the ADA pathway in an area partially screened by existing vegetation. The vault building design and colors were chosen to complement the natural setting and the existing developments. Native shrubs will be planted to add additional screening.

7/24/2020 Revision: The prefabricated restroom has been increased to a double unit. The attached design plans have been included as reference only. Site specific design plans will be approved by fire marshal at a later date.
