

Re: Record search results for the proposed MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit Project, Monterey County, CA.

Dear Mr. Tad Stearn:

Per your request received by our office on the 6th of August, 2020, a records search was conducted for the above referenced project by reviewing pertinent Northwest Information Center (NWIC) base maps that reference cultural resources records and reports, historic-period maps, and literature for Monterey County. Please note that use of the term cultural resources includes both archaeological resources and historical buildings and/or structures.

The MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit Project proposed project is the development of approximately 6 linear miles of roadway surface dedicated for express busway service (bus rapid transit). The route for the project would begin at MST's Marina Transit Exchange at Reservation Road and De Forest Road (northern terminus), and end at Playa Avenue in Sand City (southern terminus). The project consists of the following primary components; A bus-only entry into the TAMC right-of-way at Del Monte Boulevard and Palm Avenue in the City of Marina. This element requires upgraded intersection traffic and safety controls, as well as bicycle and pedestrian path improvements along Del Monte Boulevard. Two lanes (one in each direction) of dedicated busway road surface within the TAMC Monterey Branch Line right-of-way. Work within the TAMC right-of-way to construct the bus lanes will require grading. drainage improvements, retaining walls, fencing, recreation trail connections, utility relocations and other necessary improvements to create a safe, dedicated busway. A new transit station (5th Street Station) located on MST property near 5th Street east of Highway 1. The station would include bus bays, public parking, drop off area and other amenities. A new roundabout in the public right of way at California Avenue and Highway 1 southbound ramp in Sand City to better accommodate buses re-entering the public right of way. A stop/station at Playa Avenue in Sand City where SURF! riders would connect to the existing bus network. This segment of the route would utilize California

Avenue for an interim period, and ultimately use the TAMC rail-right-of way all the way to Contra Costa Street in Sand City (southern terminus). The Del Monte Boulevard/Playa Avenue and California Avenue/Playa Avenue intersections would include signalization and synchronization to improve traffic operations at this location. Excavation for the project would occur between 0 to 2 feet along 80 to 90 percent of the alignment and could occur as deep as 15 feet below existing grade at its deepest point.

Review of this information indicates that there have been twenty cultural resource studies that cover approximately 100% of the MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area (see enclosed report list). This MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area may contain one recorded archaeological resource, P-27-000385, a large habitation site. The State Office of Historic Preservation Built Environment Resources Directory (OHP BERD), which includes listings of the California Register of Historical Resources, California State Historical Landmarks, California State Points of Historical Interest, and the National Register of Historic Places, lists one recorded Historic District, the Southern Pacific Railroad District, OTIS # 516418, within and adjacent to the proposed MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area. This District is listed with a 2S, meaning this resource was individually determined eligible for the National Register (NR) by the Keeper, and listed in the California Register (CR). In addition to these inventories, the NWIC base maps show one recorded structure within the proposed MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area, P-23-002923, the Southern Pacific Railroad, as listed above in the BERD.

At the time of Euroamerican contact the Native Americans that lived in the area were speakers of the Mutsen and Rumsen languages, both of the Costanoan/Ohlone language family (Levy 1978:485). There may be one Native American resource in or adjacent to the proposed MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area referenced in the ethnographic literature, Indian Trail #47 [Davis 1961].

Based on an evaluation of the environmental setting and features associated with known sites, Native American resources in this part of Monterey County have been found in areas marginal to the ocean and Monterey Bay, and inland near intermittent and perennial watercourses, and near areas populated by oak, buckeye, manzanita, and pine, as well as near a variety of plant and animal resources. The MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area is located parallel to Monterey Bay, from 0.25 to 0.75 miles from the shore, starting in the north in the town of Marina, ending in the south approximately 0.25 miles north of Laguna Del Rey in the town of Seaside. Given the similarity of these environmental factors combined with the archaeological and ethnographic sensitivity of the area, there is a high potential for unrecorded Native American resources to be within the proposed MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid

Transit project area.

Review of historical literature and maps indicated the possibility of historic-period activity within the MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area. The General Land Office Rancho Map for Noche Buena indicated a portion of Santa Cruz Road that may extend into the project area. In addition, the 1913 Monterey USGS 15-minute topographic quadrangle depicts the Southern Pacific Railroad within the project area, and buildings and a mining claim within or adjacent to the project area. With this in mind, there is a high potential for unrecorded historic-period archaeological resources to be within the proposed MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area.

The 1947 Marina and Seaside USGS 7.5-minute topographic quadrangles depict a railroad, buildings and structures within the MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area. If present, these unrecorded buildings or structures meet the Office of Historic Preservation's minimum age standard that buildings, structures, and objects 45 years or older may be of historical value.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1) There is one recorded archaeological resource in or adjacent to the proposed MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area, P-27-000385, a large Native American habitation site. It is recommended that a professional archaeologist assess the resource and provide project-specific recommendations. Please refer to the list of consultants who meet the Secretary of Interior's Standards at http://www.chrisinfo.org.
- 2) There is a high potential of identifying Native American archaeological resources and a high potential of identifying historic-period archaeological resources in the project area. We recommend a qualified archaeologist conduct further archival and field study to identify cultural resources. Field study may include, but is not limited to, pedestrian survey, hand auger sampling, shovel test units, or geoarchaeological analyses as well as other common methods used to identify the presence of archaeological resources. Please refer to the list of consultants who meet the Secretary of Interior's Standards at http://www.chrisinfo.org.

- 3) We recommend the lead agency contact the local Native American tribe(s) regarding traditional, cultural, and religious heritage values. For a complete listing of tribes in the vicinity of the project, please contact the Native American Heritage Commission at 916/373-3710.
- 4) The proposed MST SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project area contains one recorded Historic District, the Southern Pacific Railroad District, OTIS # 516418; therefore, prior to commencement of project activities, it is recommended that this resource be assessed by a professional familiar with the architecture and history of Monterey County. In addition, if the proposed project area contains other buildings or structures that meet the minimum age requirement, prior to commencement of project activities, it is recommended that this resource be assessed by a professional familiar with the architecture and history of Monterey County. Please refer to the list of consultants who meet the Secretary of Interior's Standards at http://www.chrisinfo.org.
- 5) Review for possible historic-period buildings or structures has included only those sources listed in the attached bibliography and should not be considered comprehensive.
- 6) If archaeological resources are encountered <u>during construction</u>, work should be temporarily halted in the vicinity of the discovered materials and workers should avoid altering the materials and their context until a qualified professional archaeologist has evaluated the situation and provided appropriate recommendations. <u>Project personnel should not collect cultural resources</u>. Native American resources include chert or obsidian flakes, projectile points, mortars, and pestles; and dark friable soil containing shell and bone dietary debris, heat-affected rock, or human burials. Historic-period resources include stone or adobe foundations or walls; structures and remains with square nails; and refuse deposits or bottle dumps, often located in old wells or privies.
- 7) It is recommended that any identified cultural resources be recorded on DPR 523 historic resource recordation forms, available online from the Office of Historic Preservation's website: https://ohp.parks.ca.gov/?page_id=28351

Due to processing delays and other factors, not all of the historical resource reports and resource records that have been submitted to the Office of Historic Preservation are available via this records search. Additional information may be available through the federal, state, and local agencies that produced or paid for historical resource management work in the search area. Additionally, Native American tribes have historical resource information not in the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS) Inventory, and you should contact the California Native American Heritage Commission for information on local/regional tribal contacts.

The California Office of Historic Preservation (OHP) contracts with the California Historical Resources Information System's (CHRIS) regional Information Centers (ICs) to maintain information in the CHRIS inventory and make it available to local, state, and federal agencies, cultural resource professionals, Native American tribes, researchers, and the public.
