Project Title: Jackson Demonstration State Forest (JDSF) – Manly Gulch Trail Class III Work Site (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2020-0190-R1)

Project Location: Project is located along the existing Manly Gulch multiuse trail. The majority of the Manly Gulch Trail lies within the JDSF ownership. A short segment lies within the Mendocino Woodlands State Park. From the town of Mendocino drive east on Little Lake Road approximately 4 miles to JDSF Road 720. Turn (right) onto Forest Road 720 to the intersection with Road 730, inside the Mendocino Woodlands SP. Continue north along Road 730 for approximately 2 miles, transecting the Mendocino Woodlands to the lower Manly Gulch Trailhead. The trail follows Manly Gulch along the lower section and continues upslope until intersecting with the Forest History Trail.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2020-0190-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Mike Powers representing California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection. The project will remove an existing 14-foot wooden bridge crossing and replace with a rocked ford trail crossing, which will be performed using hand tools. The stream bed and bank will be laid back and rock armor (4-12"+ cobble) keyed-in to form a broad dip that will channel flows within the centerline of the watercourse and stabilize the banks to reduce potential for scouring and allow for passage of 100-year flow. Smaller rock material may be placed within larger rock voids to create a smooth trail surface.
