Project Title: Janicki Remediation Project (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2020-0233-R1)

Project Location (include county): The project site is located at 2851 Forest Service Rd 5N21 approximately four miles south of Burnt Ranch in Trinity County; Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 011-020-17-00.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement (Agreement) No. 1600-2020-0233-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Mr. Edward Janicki, agent for Emerald Forest Wilderness Retreats, LLC.

This project has been proposed to address sediment inputs and risk of crossing failure at four existing stream crossings on unnamed tributaries within the Mill Creek watershed. One crossing will consist of removal existing fill materials and a 4" PVC pipe to place an 18" corrugated metal pipe (CMP) culvert or armored ford to meet 100-year storm capacity to avoid obstruction of flow and minimize risk of crossing failure. A second crossing will undergo maintenance activities to replace an existing rusted 24" CMP culvert with a new 24" CMP including armoring of the fill faces to reduce sediment inputs. A third crossing will be completely decommissioned, and stream channel restored to natural conditions; while the fourth crossing, will undergo armoring of bridge abutments to prevent erosion from road surface runoff and scour from high flows.
