To Whom It May Concern,

In review of the City of Chico Vegetative Fuels Management Plan (VFMP) included in the Draft Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR), (SCH# 2020090170), dated December 2020, the California Geological Survey has the following comment and recommendation.

Comment

Page 53 of the VFMP, Heavy Equipment Use, item 11, states: "Avoid heavy equipment use on unstable slope areas, slopes with gradients exceeding 65%, slopes with gradients between 50% and 65% where the erosion hazard rating is high or extreme, or slopes with gradients over 50% that lead without flattening to sufficiently dissipate water flow and trap sediment before reaching a stream or other water resource."

However, according to page 86 and Appendix C of the PEIR, Geology and Soils, SPR SOIL-1: Slope restrictions for mechanical equipment "Ground-based equipment (e.g., masticators, feller-bunchers) will be restricted to slopes less than 30%." Soil types and percent slope are shown on Soils Maps 1-4 in Appendix D of the PEIR.

Recommendation

Due to the ambiguity in equipment limitations described above, we request the proposed slope restrictions for heavy equipment use be clarified.
