**Project Title:** Valentine Dam Removal and Water Diversion Project (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2020-0266-R1)

**Project Location (include county):** The project to be completed is located within the Point Arena River watershed, approximately 5 miles northwest of the town of Gualala, County of Mendocino, State of California. The project is located in Section 2, T11N, R16W, Mt. Diablo Base and Meridian; in the Gualala U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle.

**Project Description:** The project is limited to one (1) encroachment.
