### **Summary Of Findings**

The proposed Shell Alameda Distribution Center Remediation Project involves demolition and remediation at an existing motor oil distribution center located at 2015 Grand Street in Alameda, Alameda County, California. The proposed Project includes demolition of existing pavement, buildings, and other infrastructure; destruction of existing groundwater monitoring wells; soil excavation and offsite disposal; backfill with clean fill; and site closure.

An archaeological literature and records search was conducted at the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS) Northwest Information Center (NWIC), Sonoma State University for the proposed Project Area of Potential Effects (APE) in May 2020. Two investigations have evaluated the southern portion of the proposed Project APE; 15 other investigations have been undertaken within an area extending 1.0 mile from the proposed Project APE. Data from the NWIC indicate that there are no previously documented prehistoric and historic-period archaeological resources within the proposed Project APE; however, there are six resources located within the 1.0-mile search radius. The closest resource, P-01-000032/CA-ALA-11, is located approximately 970 feet southwest of the proposed APE.

A Phase 1 ground surface survey was not conducted due to the developed nature of the proposed Project APE and the resulting lack of exposed ground surfaces. The proposed Project APE originally consisted of marshlands that were later filled with a mixture of man-made refuse, bay mud, sand dredged from San Francisco Bay, and imported fill material. The existing facilities, including a compounding building, piping infrastructure, above ground storage tanks, truck and rail loading dock/scale, and abandoned rail lines have been operated as a motor oil blending, packaging, and distribution center since 1951. Underground storage tanks were removed in 1985 and 1996, and 37 above ground storage tanks were removed in 2013. Therefore, the potential for unknown, intact cultural resources to be present within disturbed portions of the APE is considered low. However, there is the potential, although extremely unlikely, for isolated pockets of undisturbed soils to be disturbed that may include unknown cultural resources.

In the unlikely event that unknown cultural resources are encountered during proposed Project activities, all work shall stop until a qualified archaeologist is retained to evaluate the nature and significance of the find. In the unlikely event that human remains are discovered during proposed Project activities, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that no further disturbance shall occur until the County Coroner has made the

necessary findings as to the origin and disposition of the remains pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98.

#### 1.0 Introduction

The proposed Shell Alameda Distribution Center Remediation Project (Project) is located at 2015 Grand Street in Alameda, Alameda County, California (Figures 1 and 2). Ground disturbances associated with the proposed Project will extend up to 6 feet below the existing ground surface. This report documents the background research conducted for the proposed Project by Wood Environment and Infrastructure Solutions (Wood, 2020).

## 2.0 Project Location and Description

The proposed Project is located at 2015 Grand Street, in Alameda, Alameda County, approximately 600 feet southeast of Fortmann Basin, on the Oakland West, California U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5-minute topographic quadrangle (Figure 3). The proposed Project APE would encompass approximately 4.1 acres (Figure 4).

On December 16, 1998, the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) issued Site Cleanup Requirements Order (Order) No. 98-121 due to soil and subsequent groundwater contamination at the Project site (San Francisco Bay RWQCB 1998). The Order included a Categorical Exemption from CEQA, but did not consider source removal activities, such as soil excavation. Pennzoil-Quaker State Company dba SOPUS Products (SOPUS) is proposing demolition of existing pavement, buildings, and other infrastructure; soil excavation and offsite disposal; and backfilling with clean fill as part of the proposed Project. The proposed Project includes the following as shown on Figure 4 and included in the Remedial Action Plan (RAP; Wood, 2020) for the Project:

- Demolition and removal of existing pavement, on-site buildings, structures, and aboveground storage tanks (ASTs);
- Excavation and removal of approximately 11,400 cubic yards of contaminated soil, and backfilling and grading to pre-excavation elevations.


Soil excavation associated with the proposed Project is not expected to extend deeper than 6 feet below ground surface (the anticipated depth of groundwater). Six soil test pits (10 feet long, 3 feet wide, and 6 feet deep) were recently excavated to assess ground water depths and infiltration rates.





## 3.0 Background

#### **Environment**

The proposed Project site originally consisted of marshlands that were later filled with a mixture of man-made refuse, bay mud, sand dredged from San Francisco Bay, and imported fill material. SOPUS has owned and operated the existing facilities at the proposed Project site as a blending, packaging, and distribution center for petroleum-based lubricant products (motor oil) since 1951. The southwestern portion of the proposed Project site contains a compounding building, piping infrastructure, ASTs within a tank farm, truck and rail loading dock/scale, and abandoned rail lines The northeastern portion of the Project site consists of the main administrative and warehouse building, three additional connected warehouses, storage yard, loading docks, and maintenance building and covered carport. Two underground storage tanks (USTs) were removed from the maintenance yard in the northeastern area in 1985 and two USTs were removed from inside a portion of the warehouse referred to as the Taylor Warehouse in 1996. A total of 37 ASTs were removed from the tank farm in 2013.

Environmental investigations and remediation activities have been conducted at the proposed Project site since 1985 and included the installation of numerous groundwater monitoring wells, and the drilling of numerous soil borings. Removal of approximately 410 cubic yards of soil from the southwestern area in 2002 required excavation up to 4 feet below ground surface.

There is approximately 3 to 4 feet of imported fill soil covered by gravel in the former tank farm in the southwestern portion of the proposed Project APE, and there is approximately 3 to 4 feet of imported fill soil covered by 8 inches of concrete throughout the majority of the northeastern portion of the proposed Project APE.

## **Ethnography**

The following discussion is summarized from the Alameda Marina Master Plan Draft Environmental Impact Report (Environmental Science Associates [ESA], 2017).

The Ohlone occupied a large area from San Francisco down to the Big Sur and Salinas rivers. The area included coastal and open valley environments that supported a wide variety of resources such as grass seeds, acorns, bulbs and tubers, rabbits and other small mammals, antelope, deer, elk, and a variety of birds.

Ohlone society was disrupted by missionization, disease, and displacement. Today, the Ohlone still have a strong presence in the San Francisco Bay area.

#### **Prehistory**

The following discussion is summarized from the Alameda Marina Master Plan Draft Environmental Impact Report (ESA 2017).

Archaeologist N.C. Nelson surveyed archaeological sites in the San Francisco Bay region between 1906 and 1908, documenting over 400 "earth mounds and shell heaps". Milliken et al. (2007) defined four broad cultural periods for the San Francisco Bay region: the Paleoindian Period, the Early Period, the Middle Period, and the Late Period.

#### **Paleoindian Period (11,500 – 8,000 B.C.)**

The Paleoindian Period is characterized by big-game hunting. There is no evidence of Paleoindian Period occupation in the San Francisco Bay region.

### Early Period (8,000 -500 B.C.)

The Early Period is characterized by large, wide-stemmed, and leaf-shaped projectile points as well as milling slabs and handstones. Cut shell beads and the mortar and pestle are first introduced during this period, indicating the beginning of sedentism.

### Middle Period (500 B.C. - A.D. 1,050)

During the Middle Period, highly mobile groups of hunter-gatherers began to establish long-term base camps in locations that allowed exploitation of a more diverse range of resources. The establishment of sites in a wide range of environments and the introduction of concave-base projectile points suggest the economic base was growing and becoming more diverse. A dramatic cultural change occurred around A.D. 430 as evidenced by the collapse of the Olivella saucer bead trade network.

#### *Late Period (A.D. 1,050 – 1,550)*

During the Late Period, the development of social complexity is evidenced by the establishment of large, central villages and specialized activity sites. Characteristic hunting equipment and artifacts included the bow and arrow, small corner-notched projectile points, and a variety of beads and ornaments.

### History

The following discussion is summarized from the Alameda Marina Master Plan Draft Environmental Impact Report (ESA 2017).

Spanish explorers Pedro Fages and Reverend Juan Crespi passed through the eastern San Francisco Bay area in 1772. In 1821, Mexico gained independence from Spain and large expanses of land were granted to military heroes and loyalists. Portions of El Cerrito, Berkeley, Albany, Oakland, Piedmont, and Alameda were included in the 44,880-acre (35-square mile) Rancho San Antonio that was granted to Luis Peralta in 1820 by the last Spanish governor of California, Governor Pablo Vincente de Solá. The grant was later divided between his four surviving sons with Antonio Maria Peralta receiving all of Alameda and much of Oakland. Alameda derived its original name, "the Encinal", from the large stands of native oaks.

William Worthington Chipman and Gideon Aughinbaugh purchased "the Encinal" in 1851 and subdivided the land for residences and orchards. The Town of Alameda was granted a charter by the State Legislature in 1854. In 1902, the Tidal Canal was completed, and Alameda became an island. Major shipyards were established along the northern and southern shores.

Alameda experienced boom and bust cycles between 1920 and 1970. The entry of the United States in World War II focused the City's attention on the war effort. During World War II the city's population reached an all-time high of 89,000 as shifts in the City's shipyards ran around the clock.

#### 4.0 Sources Consulted

### **Cultural Resources Records Search**

An archaeological site record and literature search was conducted at the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS) Northwest Information Center (NWIC) at Sonoma State University for the proposed APE on June 10, 2020 (Appendix A).

Two investigations (Cartier et al. 1999, Busby 2002) have been undertaken within the proposed APE. Fifteen investigations have been undertaken within an area extending 1.0 mile from the proposed APE.

An investigation was conducted to evaluate the historic and architectural significance of structures within a 20-acre area along Buena Vista Avenue that encompassed the southeastern portion of the proposed Project APE bound by Eagle Avenue on the south, Hibbard Street on the west, and Grand Street on the east (Cartier et al.,

1999). None of the Project APE structures appear to be potentially eligible for inclusion on the California Register of Historic Resources or the National Register of Historic Places.

Busby (2002) conducted archaeological monitoring for the Marina Cove Project that encompassed the same southeastern portion of the proposed Project APE bound by Eagle Avenue on the south, Hibbard Street on the west, and Grand Street on the east. The archaeological monitoring documented "soils... [that] were notably atypical of the general area" (Busby 2002). No prehistoric or significant historic-period materials were identified.

No prehistoric or historic-period archaeological resources are recorded within the proposed APE. Six resources are recorded within 1.0 mile of the proposed APE (Table 1). The closest resource, P-01-000032/CA-ALA-11, is located approximately 970 feet southwest of the proposed APE. A description of the resource and its location are presented below.

#### P-01-000032/CA-ALA-11

The large, prehistoric shell midden is located approximately 970 feet (0.2 mile) southeast of the proposed Project APE. The Archaeological Site Record for the site indicates that human remains were encountered in 1945, the 1950s, 1997, and 2001. The midden, originally recorded by Nelson in 1909, along with other shell mounds in the San Francisco Bay area, consists of shell (oyster, mussel, clam), chert and obsidian flakes, Olivella shell beads, and abalone shell beads and pendants.

#### P-01-000092/CA-ALA-315

The prehistoric site is located approximately 4,750 feet (0.9 mile) northeast of the proposed Project APE and north of Brooklyn Basin. The Archaeological Site Record for the site does not provide any information (size measurements, description of archaeological materials, and sketch map). The site was recorded by Nelson in 1909 along with other shell mounds in the San Francisco Bay area. Because the site was recorded over 100 years ago, very little information about the site remains. The site location depicted by the NWIC is considered approximate.

#### P-01-010697

The resource is located approximately 4,320 feet (0.8 mile) northeast of the proposed Project APE and north of Brooklyn Basin. The Archaeological Site Record indicates that shell (clam and oyster) and transfer print ceramics were observed but does not provide any other information (size measurements, and sketch map). The Archaeological Site Record indicates that "there is not enough cultural material or ground visibility to definitively record this as an archaeological site." No archaeological testing has been conducted to determine if the shell and ceramics that were observed and recorded represent a prehistoric and/or historic-period archaeological site.

#### P-01-010698

The resource is located approximately 4,750 feet (0.9 mile) east-northeast of the proposed Project APE and north of Brooklyn Basin. The Archaeological Site Record indicates that marine shell was observed but does not provide any other information (size measurements, description of materials, and sketch map). The Archaeological Site Record indicates that "there is not enough evidence to record this as an archaeological site... but the location should be considered sensitive." No archaeological testing has been conducted to determine if the marine shell that was identified and recorded represents a prehistoric or historic-period archaeological site.

#### P-01-010733

The site is located approximately 4,320 feet (0.8 mile) southeast of the proposed Project APE. It consists of 14 small trash pits in a 160 X 115-foot area at the southern corner of Lincoln Avenue and Oak Street. The trash pits contain ceramics, glass, whole and fragmentary bottles, metal, bricks, shell (abalone and oyster), and bone.

#### P-01-011001

The resource is located approximately 4,320 feet (0.8 mile) northeast of the proposed Project APE and north of Brooklyn Basin. The Archaeological Site Survey Record for the site mentions a "big indian shellmound" but does not provide any other information (size measurements, description of archaeological materials, and sketch map). The site location depicted by the NWIC is considered approximate.

#### **Native American Consultation**

A search of the Native American Heritage Commission's (NAHC's) Sacred Lands File (SLF) was requested on May 7, 2020, and conducted on May 11, 2020 (Sarah Fonseca, NAHC Cultural Resources Analyst) to determine the presence of any Native American cultural resources within the APE and general vicinity (Appendix B). The NAHC's SLF search response states "the results were positive", indicating tribal resources are noted in the proposed Project site vicinity. The NAHC identified eight Native American contacts who would potentially have specific knowledge as to whether cultural resources are identified in the APE. Letters to these Native American contacts were mailed on June 4 and 5, 2020. Follow-up phone calls were made, and the original letter was sent by electronic mail on July 21, 2020. Five representatives responded to Wood. The Native American consultation results are summarized in Table 2 below.

#### **Permit History Report**

A certified Permit History Report for the proposed Project APE was requested from the City of Alameda Planning, Building & Transportation Department on June 4, 2020 (Appendix C). The certified Permit History Report indicates the earliest permit was associated with a "warehouse and cooperage" in 1952.

The proposed Project APE is not listed on the City of Alameda's Historic Building Study List and does not require a Certificate of Approval or a special permit required to perform construction, alteration, or demolition work on historic structures (personal communication, Henry Dong, City of Alameda Planning, Building & Transportation Department). Therefore, none of the buildings or structures within the proposed Project APE are included on the list of Alameda Historical Monuments.

#### 5.0 Field Methods

A Phase 1 survey (i.e., an intensive, pedestrian ground surface survey of the proposed Project APE to assess the presence/absence of cultural resources to identify potential impacts associated with the proposed Project) was not conducted due to the developed nature of the proposed Project APE and the resulting lack of exposed ground surfaces.

The proposed Project APE originally consisted of marshlands that were later filled with a mixture of man-made refuse, bay mud, sand dredged from San Francisco Bay, and imported fill material. There is approximately 3 to 4 feet of imported fill soil covered by gravel in the former tank farm area in the southwestern portion of the proposed Project APE, and there is approximately 3 to 4 feet of imported fill soil covered by 8 inches of concrete throughout the majority of the northeastern portion of the proposed Project APE. The remainder and central portion of the proposed Project APE is developed with buildings.

Due to the previously disturbed nature of the proposed Project APE, the potential for intact cultural resources within the proposed Project APE is considered extremely unlikely.

### 6.0 Study Findings and Conclusions

The proposed Project APE originally consisted of marshlands that were later filled with a mixture of man-made refuse, bay mud, sand dredged from San Francisco Bay, and imported fill material. There is approximately 3 to 4 feet of imported fill soil covered by gravel or concrete throughout the proposed Project APE. Due to the previously disturbed nature of the proposed Project APE, the potential for intact cultural resources within the proposed Project APE is considered extremely unlikely.

If cultural materials are identified during implementation of the proposed Project within previously excavated soil that has been placed as construction fill during previous construction activities at the Shell Alameda Distribution Center, the materials would be redeposited and not in their original depositional location. Cultural materials that

have been redeposited and are not in their original depositional location are not considered significant artifacts according to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

#### 7.0 Other Resources

### **Unidentified Cultural Resources**

In the event that cultural resources are discovered during proposed Project activities, all work shall stop until a qualified archaeologist can assess the significance of the find.

In the unlikely event that human remains are discovered during proposed Project activities, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that no further disturbance shall occur until the Coroner has made findings as to the origin and disposition of the remains pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98.







Pennzoil-Quaker State Company dba SOPUS Products (Shell) has contracted Wood Environment and Infrastructure Solutions, Inc. (Wood E&IS) to prepare an Archaeological Resource Management Report for proposed demolition and remediation at the Shell Alameda Distribution Center located at 2015 Grand Street, in Alameda (Figure 1). The report will include a records search of the Northwest Information Center (NWIC), Sonoma State University to determine the presence of recorded archaeological sites within the proposed Project Area of Potential Effect (APE) and a 1.0-mile buffer. Due to the developed nature of the proposed Project APE and the resulting lack of exposed ground surfaces, an intensive pedestrian ground surface survey will not be conducted.

We are interested in any information, questions, or concerns you may have regarding Native American heritage resources related to proposed Project impacts on cultural resources.

## **Project Site Background**

The proposed Project site originally consisted of marshlands that were later filled with a mixture of man-made refuse, bay mud, sand dredged from San Francisco Bay, and imported fill material.

Pennzoil Products Company (now Shell) has operated the existing facilities at the proposed Project site since 1951. The southwestern portion of the proposed Project site contains a compounding building, piping infrastructure, above-ground storage tanks (ASTs) within a former tank farm, truck loading area/scale, and

abandoned rail lines. Underground storage tanks (USTs) were removed in 1985 and 1996, and 37 ASTs were removed from the former tank farm in 2013.

Environmental investigations and remediation activities have been conducted at the proposed Project site starting in 1985 and include the installation of numerous monitoring and extraction wells, and the drilling of numerous soil borings. Removal of approximately 410 cubic yards of soil in 2002 required excavation up to 4 feet below ground surface.

There is approximately 3 to 4 feet of imported fill soil covered by gravel in the former tank farm in the southwestern portion of the proposed Project APE, and there is approximately 3 to 4 feet of imported fill soil covered by 8 inches of concrete throughout the majority of the other portions of the proposed Project APE.

## **Project Description**

The proposed Project involves the demolition of existing buildings and infrastructure, soil remediation, and site closure. The San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board issued Site Cleanup Requirements Order No. 98-121 for the Project site, which included a categorical exemption from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), but did not consider source removal activities such as soil excavation that are a part of the proposed Project. The proposed Project includes the following:

- Excavation of soil test pits to determine groundwater depths and infiltration rates (recently 6 soil pits were excavated that measured 3 by 10 feet and 5 to 6 feet deep);
- Demolition and removal of existing on-site buildings, structures, and ASTs; and
- Excavation and removal of approximately 11,400 cubic yards of contaminated soil, and backfilling and grading to pre-excavation elevations.

### **Background Research**

An archaeological site record search at the NWIC was requested on May 7, 2020; results of the record search are pending. The record search will identify all known archaeological sites, historic resources, and any previous cultural resource surveys within the proposed Project APE, including a 1.0-mile buffer extending from the proposed Project APE.

A search of the Native American Heritage Commission's (NAHC's) Sacred Lands File (SLF) was requested on May 7, 2020 to determine the presence of any Native American heritage resources within the proposed Project APE (see attached). Sarah Fonseca, NAHC Cultural Resources Analyst, responded to this request in a letter received on May 11, 2020 (see attached). The SLF search response stated "the results were positive."


