Project Title: Rolling Meadows Ranch Bridge Repair Project (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2020-0285-R1)

Project Location (include county): The project is located within the Eel River watershed, approximately 6 miles northeast of the community of McCann, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Section 3, T1S, R4E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Blocksburg U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Numbers 217-031-012 and 217-031-001; latitude 40.3447 N and longitude -123.7109 W at the bridge location.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2020-0285-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Andy Machata.

The project is limited to one encroachment. The single encroachment is to replace all components of an existing bridge except the streambank and center abutments within Larabee Creek. Work will include a maximum of two instream crossings with heavy equipment.
