**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife is issuing an amendment for the Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2019-0228-R6, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP), represented by Adam Perez.

The amendment includes 1) using Articulated Concrete Blocks (ACB) instead of concrete and rip-rap to construct the Arizona low-water crossing and 2) the addition of a 91' X 61' ACB area to protect an existing penstock during large run-off events. The amendment will result in an additional 0.12 acres of permanent impacts, totaling 0.15 acres, to areas subject to Fish and Game Code 1602 resources.
