I was recently requested to review the Request for Review of the Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration environmental documents related to the proposed Madera Station Relocation Project, in the Madera Area. The California Highway Patrol's (CHP) interest in commenting surrounds our concerns for the sustained ability to provide for the safety, service and security, of those we serve. My review raised the following concerns:

- 1. Heavy construction dust so near the State Route 99 Corridor is a serious traffic safety concern. Dust carried to the west by even light winds can adversely affect visibility on the freeway. Proper worksite dust management can help mitigate this concern.
- 2. The Madera Area is an agricultural community. This means the outdoor workforce is large. Pathogens, such as Valley fever (coccidioidomycosis), carried in construction dust, are a concern for all who live, work and travel in the Madera Area. Proper worksite dust management can help mitigate this concern.

The Project consists of two phases, Phase it consists of elements related to the Rejocated Medern San Josephine Station (Rejocated Station) from Medera Acres to the location described in the vicinity of Avenue 12. The existing Medera San Josephine Station would no longer be used for San Josephine Seasons and acres to the Rejocated Station. Phase it would be a station platform that is approximately 600 feet. New trackwork that would require build out would tight to the existing BNSF mill and would require turnout tracks and have a length of 2,350 feet. A new access new would be constructed to provide access to the Rejocation Station Intellities and would run adjacent to the OAHSR Project right-lof-way. Phase 2 consists of high-speed rail improvements at he Relocated Station to allow for future HSR service along California's future Merced to Bakershold High-Speed Rail interim Operating Segment, to access the Relocated Station. This HSR services is anticipated to be operated by the SUPA. Phase 2 would build out a new HSR station platform that would be approximately 1,000 feet in length. A more detailed project description is provided in the IS/MND.
