The proposed project provides corrective measures to prevent deterioration and extend life of pavement along State Route 55 at the intersections of 17th Street, Harbor Boulevard, and 19th Street in the city of Costa Mesa, Orange County. Work includes upgrading existing asphalt pavement with Rubberized Hot Mix Asphalt (RHMA) and replacing pavement delineation and loop detectors.
