#### **Project Location:**

The Project is located along the western edge of the Feather River within the city limits of Yuba City, in Sutter County. Coordinates are 39°08'57.0"N 121°36'31.9"W

## **General Plan Designation:**

The Feather River Parkway is designated "Parks, Recreation and Open Space" in the Yuba City General Plan (May 2018)

#### **Zoning:**

The Feather River Parkway is zoned as a "Flood District" by the City of Yuba City. Public facilities and recreational facilities are an allowed use of an area zoned as "Flood District."

#### **Project Description:**

The Pedestrian Bridge and Connector Trail Installation Project (Project) proposes installation of a new pedestrian bridge and connector trail in the Feather River Parkway (Parkway). The Parkway is an approximately 90-acre riverfront park in Yuba City that extends along the edge of the Feather River. The proposed bridge would be a prefabricated structure of no more than 50 feet over an ephemeral drainage. The bridge would connect users on the west side of the ephemeral drainage to the existing trails, pavilion, and picnic area on the east side of the ephemeral drainage. Including the length of the bridge, the connector trail would be approximately 200 feet, and would consist of installation of a new concrete pathway (extending from the new bridge) that would connect to an existing pathway. The Project is located in the southern end of the Parkway just north of a Feather River Parkway pond and southeast of the maintenance road near the secondary gated entrance to the park. Figure 1 shows the Project's location in relation to the Feather River Parkway. Figure 2 provides a detailed location map of the proposed Project.

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#### **CATEGORICAL EXEMPTION FINDING**

The City of Yuba City has determined this Project is categorically exempt under CEQA Guidelines Article 19, Section 15303 New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures as a Class 3 categorical exemption. A Class 3 categorical exemption consists of "construction and location of limited number of new, small facilities or structures; installation of small new equipment and facilities in small structures; and the conversion of existing small structures from one use to another where only minor modifications are made to the exterior of the structure."

## **Exceptions to Categorical Exemptions**

In accordance with CEQA Guidelines, Section 15300.2, and Public Resources Code, Section 21084, the City has considered whether circumstances exist that would create an exception to this categorical exemption and has not found that any such circumstances exist. As a categorically exempt project, the City has made the following findings:

#### **Discussion:**

The Project site is a small area (less than one acre) within the Parkway. The approximately 90acre Parkway was created by the City of Yuba City (City) over the period 2012 through 2020. The Parkway is located within the City limits of Yuba City and within the Feather River floodplain and is owned and managed by the City. The Parkway is surrounded by mixed use development including retail, light industrial, high and low density residential, and utilities. The Parkway has been used for agricultural production in the past and is not an area with important mineral resources.

City of Yuba City 11/20/2020 Page 2 There are no environmental impacts identified with installation of the pedestrian bridge or connector trail, and there are no other projects of the same type planned within the immediate area that would cause a cumulative impact. There are no current unusual circumstances that would create the reasonable possibility of any significant effects associated with the Project.

Multiple biological surveys of the Project area have been conducted associated with recreational and habitat improvements implemented by the City since 2014 (Feather River Parkway Project Phase I and II) and the City continues to monitor for identified sensitive species in the area including valley elderberry longhorn beetle. The area for installation of the pedestrian bridge, while near the Feather River Parkway pond, is approximately 125 feet outside of the riparian zone and 150 feet from the ordinary high-water mark (OHWM) of the Feather River Parkway pond.

There is no State Scenic Highway in the vicinity of the Feather River Parkway. The Project does not involve removal of any large live trees, and there are no rock outcroppings or historic buildings on site to be affected by Project activities. As shown by a search of the Department of Toxic Substances Control EnviroStor database, there are no hazardous waste sites within or approximate to the Feather River (DTSC 2020).

Potential impacts to cultural resources were analyzed during the environmental review for development of the Parkway. This included thorough record searches of the Parkway area and, in 2010 (and updated in 2017), a cultural resource pedestrian survey by qualified archeologists. This survey and the associated cultural resource inventory identified only one historical resource in the Parkway. This was the abandoned "sewer farm" operated as part of the City Department of Public Works water treatment plant. These sewer ponds were determined ineligible for the National Register of Historic Places listing (City of Yuba City 2014). As there are no historical or archaeological resources on site and as the activities associated with the Project are limited to the addition of a small walkway and structure (short bridge), the Project would not impact historical or archaeological resources.


