ATTACHMENT TO NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

Recreational Crab Marine Life Protection Measures

The California Fish and Game Commission (Commission) has taken final action under the Fish and Game Code and the Administrative Procedure Act with respect to the proposed project on December 9, 2020. On August 19, 2020, the Commission authorized publication of a notice of its intent to amend sections 29.80, 29.85, and 701 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations ("CCR") that establish new measures to reduce marine life entanglement risk from recreational crab traps (California Regulatory Notice Register Z2020-0915-07). The Commission held a discussion hearing on October 14, 2020 and adopted the proposed regulations on December 9, 2020.

Categorical Exemptions to Protect Natural Resources and the Environment

In compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA; Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.), the Commission adopted the regulation pertaining to recreational crab trap fishing on the categorical exemptions contained in CEQA Guidelines sections 15307 (Action by Regulatory Agencies for Protection of Natural Resources) and 15308 (Action by Regulatory Agencies for Protection of the Environment). The exemptions apply to agency actions to protect natural resources and the environment, respectively.

The proposed regulations would put in place additional requirements for recreational crab trap fishing such as a trap limit for individual fishers and a maximum service interval. The proposal would also improve information-gathering by identifying all anglers with a dedicated validation and by requiring all traps be marked with lettering that identifies the traps as recreational crab traps. The proposal also gives the Director of the Department of Fish and Wildlife the authority to restrict the fishery when risk of entangling protected marine life is particularly high. The proposal overall is designed to minimize trap loss and entanglement of marine life and to improve information-gathering for a more sustainable fishery, and thus would serve to protect natural resources and the environment.
