The parcel is improved in such a way that parking is extremely limited; the restaurant is underparked based on the County parking standards (County Code Ch.21.76.140 - Off-Street Parking - Restaurants and bars) with only 7 out of 40 required on-site parking spaces located on the parcel but within the required setback areas, and all other parking is located within the public right-of-way via unmarked, non-designated, on-street parking.
The Department of Environmental Resources has received complaints from the public with respect to the on-site wastewater treatment system, due to the proximity of the leach lines to the river and the capacity of the system with the expanded seating.
