TO ADOPT A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION

for the

LODI UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT – PROPOSED SCHOOL SITE – STOCKTON SITE I PROJECT San Joaquin County, California

This is to advise that the Lodi Unified School District has prepared an Initial Study (IS) / Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) to evaluate the environmental impacts of the project identified below, as required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Based upon the conclusions set forth in the IS / MND, the Lodi Unified School District proposes to adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration. As mandated by State Law, the review period for this document is a minimum of 30 (thirty) days.

Project: The Lodi Unified School District (LUSD) is proposing to construct a new school site that will be approximately 18.5 acres in size after property line adjustments. The proposed school site – Stockton Site I – is still in the design concept phase, however, LUSD anticipates the proposed school site would serve approximately 800 students with approximately 35 (K-8) classrooms to accommodate the ongoing West Lakes Development in Stockton, California. Water and sewer services for the school would be provided by the City of Stockton Municipal Utilities District.

The proposed project site is within the footprint of the Westlake at Spanos Park West Master Development Plan (2004), Development Agreement, and Environmental Impact Report (State Clearinghouse No. 2004052105) which created a framework for future development, including the development of a future school. The City of Stockton approved the Westlake Master Development Plan which included a 10-acre school site listed to be developed by LUSD and was tentatively located in the proposed Site "I" Area.

Location: The subject property has no site address; the subject property is located at the corner of Westlake Drive & Regatta Lane, Stockton, San Joaquin County, California (APNs: 066-050-070, -080 portion of). The site consists of vacant land. The overall parcel, pending a proposed property line adjustment, is approximately 18.5 acres in size. Eight Mile Road is located approximately 0.75 miles north and Interstate 5 is located approximately 1 mile east of the site. The proposed campus is located adjacent to a suburban housing tract to the west and agriculture land to the west, with Pixley Slough/Bear Creek adjacent south. The City of Stockton General Plan Land Use Map designates the proposed campus as "Mixed Use".

The Lodi Unified School District has reviewed the proposed project and determined that although the proposed project could have a significant effect on the environment, there will not be a significant effect in this case because revisions in the project have been made by or agreed to by the project proponent. The proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared pursuant to Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15070 of the California Code of Regulations.
