Request for a Use Permit for 2,000 square feet of indoor cannabis nursery in a 2,000-square foot agriculture structure (barn) on a 60.58-acre parcel. The proposed project would also include construction of a 100-square foot ADA compliant bathroom. The project would operate between 9:00 am to 6:00 pm, Monday through Friday.
