NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

Marin County **Environmental Coordination and Review**

- Project Name: Access Ramp to Corte Madera Creek Channel; Cedar Ave, Kentfield, Marin County 1.
- 2. Project Location: The project site is located on an undeveloped Flood Control District-owned parcel (APN 074-011-61) adjacent to the Corte Madera Creek concrete channel at the intersection of Locust Ave. and Cedar Ave. in the unincorporated community of Kentfield in Ross Valley.
- Project Description: The primary project objective is to construct a permanent ramp into the concretized section of the Corte Madera Creek so that construction and maintenance equipment, such as trucks, excavators and skid steer loaders, can access the channel for creek maintenance. The project will construct a permanent access ramp approximately 15 feet wide by 80 feet long (1200 sq ft), and sloping from Cedar Avenue down to the existing creek channel bed that is approximately 10 feet below ground at an approximately 15 percent grade. Concrete floodwalls will be constructed adjacent to the ramp on both the upstream and downstream side of the ramp that connect into the existing Corte Madera Creek concrete channel walls. After construction, the floodwalls will be approximately 80 feet long and up to one (1) foot above existing ground elevation.
- 4. Public Agency Approving Project: County of Marin Department of Public Works; Patrick Echols, Interim Director
- Project Sponsor: Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District 5.
- 6. CEQA Exemption Status: Categorical Exemption: 15303 New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures
- 7. Reasons for Exemption: This project qualifies for the 15303 exemption because it involves new minor construction of a small structure, an access ramp with a footprint of 1200 sq ft, on a vacant parcel. The project is designed to avoid potential for significant environmental impacts. The new access ramp floodwalls join to the existing concrete channel walls seamlessly and do not intrude into the creek channel, so there are no negative impacts to streamflow. The height of the access ramp walls have been minimized as much as possible to reduce the size of the structure while providing an equivalent level of flood protection to proposed floodwall at the adjacent Corte Madera Creek Flood Risk Management Project. During construction, erosion and water quality best management practices will be followed. After construction, all disturbed areas will be replanted with native grass seed and covered with erosion control blankets.



NOTICE

Each project applicant shall remit to the county clerk the environmental filing fee before or at the time of filing a Notice of Determination (Pub. Resources Code, § 21152; Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subdivision (d); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5). Without the appropriate fee, statutory or categorical exemption, or a valid No Effect Determination issued by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), the Notice of Determination is not operative, vested, or final, and shall not be accepted by the county clerk.

COUNTY DOCUMENTARY HANDLING FEE

The county clerk may charge a documentary handling fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per filing in addition to the environmental filing fee (Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subd. (e); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5, subd. (g)(1)). A county board of supervisors shall have the authority to increase or decrease the fee or charge, that is otherwise authorized to be levied by another provision of law, in the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee or charge is levied (Gov. Code, § 54985, subd. (a)).

Within 30 days after the end of each month in which the environmental filing fees are collected, each county shall summarize and record the amount collected on the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31) and remit the amount collected to the State Treasurer. Identify the remittance on Form No. CA25 as "Environmental Document Filing Fees" per Fish and Game Code section 711.4.

The county clerk shall mail the following documents to CDFW on a monthly basis:

DOCUMENT RETENTION

The county shall retain two copies of the cash receipt (for lead agency and county clerk) and a copy of all documents described above for at least 12 months.

RECEIPT NUMBER

- # The first two digits automatically populate by making the appropriate selection in the County/State Agency of Filing drop down menu.
- # The next eight digits automatically populate when a date is entered.
- # The last three digits correspond with the sequential order of issuance for each calendar year. For example, the first receipt number issued on January 1 should end in 001. If a county issued 252 receipts for the year ending on December 31, the last receipt number should end in 252. CDFW recommends that counties and state agencies 1) save a local copy of this form, and 2) track receipt numbers on a spreadsheet tabbed by month to ensure accuracy.
