The rockslide that occurred on February 1, 2021 resulted in damage to the existing rock mesh drapery. A contract has been awarded through the Emergency Director's Order to implement the following repairs within the affected area:

- Assess/repair the damage to the top anchors and cable supports.
- Reinstall the cable system and reattach the wire mesh fabric.
- · Repair wire mesh where it has been torn.
- Raise the lower portion of the wire mesh from 5 feet to 10 feet above the bottom catchment area. Raising the bottom wire mesh should help to prevent this slope protection system failure from happening again.

Special Concerns

The original installation of the rock mesh drapery in 2020 took place in marginally suitable habitat for the Trinity bristle snail (TBS), as well as other protected snail species. A pre-construction survey to move the snails from the overland access route was conducted. During the installation process, crews were limited to on-foot access only to the helicopter drop zone at the top of the ridge. If overland access is needed for current emergency repair efforts, the contractor must use the existing, delineated rope path.

The emergency repair project is located next to the perennial McDonald Creek. This creek may contain foothill yellow-legged frogs, southern torrent salamanders, salmonids, northwestern pond turtles, and coastal tailed frog. No construction materials or debris may enter the creek.

Staging

Staging will occur within the boundaries of Caltrans existing Right of Way.

Disposal/Borrow

No borrow sites will be needed for this project. Excess material will be disposed of at a SMARA Pit run by Mercer Fraser.

Right of Way

Work will be completed within Caltrans Right of Way

Consultation/Coordination

The project consists of emergency repairs to previously completed construction; no additional tribal consultation/coordination is needed.

Permits

No permits are required.
