Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement, EPIMS-SIS-18414-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Siskiyou Telephone Company, as represented by Carl Eastlick.

<u>Project 1</u> is limited to the horizontal direction drilling (HDD) of a bore path under Mill Creek through which 5-inch high density polyethylene (HDPE) conduit and underground fiber optic cable will be placed.
