Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

Proposed residential development on a vacant parcel involving construction of a 1,368 square foot onestory single-family dwelling inclusive of an attached garage, and a 373 square foot attached storage area. The project also involves modification of parking standards, development on slopes exceeding 30 percent, and development within 750 feet of known archaeological resources.

<u>Cultural Resources</u>: The proposed development is sited in an area of known archaeological and tribal cultural resources. Although surveys and testing indicate a low potential for impacts to resources, potential impacts to cultural resources can not be ruled out. Therefore, mitigation measures are recommended to require archaeological and tribal monitors to be present to observe all excavation and grading activities during construction on the site. Upon implementation of mitigation measures, potential impacts to cultural resources would be reduced to a less than significant level.

<u>Cultural Resources</u>: The project site is known to be sensitive for subsurface resources, and impacts to unknown tribal cultural resources are potentially significant.
