REASONS WHY THIS PROJECT IS EXEMPT OR DOES NOT REQUIRE FURTHER ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION:

The proposed Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15183 (Projects Consistent with a Community Plan, General Plan, or Zoning), as the project is consistent with the General Plan. The proposed Community Mobility Resilience Plan is consistent with and implements the actions outlined in the General Plan, specifically Implementation Action 7.11 (Develop a Resilience Plan) and Action 9.2 (Resiliency Plan). These actions defined the need to develop a Resilience Plan intended to identify ways the City and its residents and businesses can improve their ability to withstand and adapt to the impacts of climate change. Additionally, the Community Mobility Resilience Plan builds on the Vulnerability Assessment completed for the General Plan to minimize and mitigate risks to the transportation network.

Furthermore, State CEQA Guidelines Section 15262 provides an exemption for feasibility and planning studies for future actions which have not been approved or adopted. Actions that have a legally binding effect on later activities are not included in this exemption. The Community Mobility Resiliency Plan documents potential impacts of climate change on the transportation system in key areas such as changes in annual temperatures and extreme heat events; changes in precipitation and flooding; and global and statewide trends in transportation to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions (e.g., reduce fuel consumption, vehicle miles traveled (VMT), and single-occupancy vehicle use; increase biking, walking, and public transit use). The Plan outlines a range of strategies and actions for both mitigations and responses to the identified risks.

The implementation of any of the specific strategies identified in the Plan would include specific follow up, CEQA analysis, and approval as needed. Therefore, this Project qualifies for the identified exemption and no further environmental review is required.
