**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number EPIMS-TRI-16029-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Mr. Eric Taft.

The project is limited to 6 encroachments on unnamed tributaries to the South Fork Trinity River. Three are to upgrade existing stream crossings and work will include some or all of the following: excavation, culvert removal, culvert replacement, backfilling and compaction of fill, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion. Three encroachments are for water diversion for domestic use. Work for the water diversion will include use and maintenance of the water diversion infrastructure in compliance with this agreement and removal of remnant dam at one of the locations.
